Warren Heritage Society Announces Season Opening with New Bing Crosby Exhibition

Front Royal, VA - The Warren Heritage Society (WHS) announces it will be opening for the 2025 season on Wednesday, April 2, and is excited to welcome guests back from the winter break for tours, archives research, and programs.

In addition to our wonderful museums and collection, a new exhibition, "Riding High: 75 Years Later" will be on display in the Ivy Lodge Donaldson Annex. To celebrate the 75th anniversary of the Riding High world premiere that took place in Front Royal, the exhibition displays items from the Laura V. Hale Archives. Throughout the exhibition there will be special programs that will highlight Bing Crosby, the film Riding High, and the 1950's.

"For more than 75 years the Warren County community has been connected with the legacy of Bing Crosby, whether it is games at Bing Crosby stadium or memories from his visits," said Teresa Henry, President of the WHS Board of Directors.
